SUMMARY

We are looking for a Call-In Family Medicine MD/DO/ARNP. Call-In Providers support WHC's mission by taking outpatient clinic shifts on an as-needed/as-able basis for our regular MD/DO/ARNP family medicine providers when those providers are out of office. Call-In Providers are paid on an hourly basis at a competitive rate. The available shifts vary from week to week and month to month. Family Medicine MD/DO is preferred, but Family Medicine ARNP's or Internal Medicine and Pediatric MD/DO's are encouraged to apply as well.

QUALIFICATIONS

To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily. The requirements listed below are representative of the knowledge, skill, and/or ability required. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

1. For Physicians, Hawaii MD or DO license, Federal DEA, and State Narcotics license required. Board Certification required. For nurse practitioners, valid Hawaii RN license, APRN-RX license required.
2. Basic Life Support for the Health Care Provider certification is required.
3. Two-Step Tuberculosis clearance is required prior to start of employment.
4. Proof of Hepatitis B immunization is required prior to start of employment.
5. Proof of COVID-19 vaccination is required prior to start of employment.

6. Experience with Electronic Medical Records system is preferred. Will be required to work on Electronic Medical Records system. Use of email is required.
7. Familiarity with the communities to be served is preferred.
8. Demonstrated ability to communicate effectively with individuals, groups, and professionals in a culturally appropriate manner.
9. Demonstrated ability to work effectively as a member of a team.
10. Maintains strict confidentiality of all patients and employee information in compliance with HIPAA regulations.
11. Enforces clinic policies and procedures to ensure that the principles of Waimanalo Health Center are implemented.
12. Must have good communication, supervisory and organizational skills as well as a good understanding of patient and work flow processes.

EDUCATION AND/OR EXPERIENCE

For Physicians: Graduation from an accredited medical school and completion of residency in the United States required. Board certification is preferred.

For Nurse Practitioners: Training in an accredited nursing program and state nursing license is required. Valid Hawaii RN license and Hawaii APRN-RX license required.
